You are expected to read the messages/posts.

This year, the student will refine the communicative skills introduced in previous Spanish courses. The student will enhance his/her listening skills, reading comprehension, writing skills and cultural understanding. NYS Checkpoint B is divided between both the Spanish 2 (9th grade) and Spanish 3 (10th grade) curriculums. At the Checkpoint B level, students are expected to initiate, sustain and expand upon conversations in the target language. At the culmination of Spanish 3, students will take the Comprehensive Final Exam (Regents Credit) in June.

Use of Technology in Class:

The intrinsic nature of a world language class requires active participation. (listening, speaking, observing gestures, etc) As such, and as a matter of respect, you are asked to refrain from using your cell phone in class.

Once class begins, please be "unplugged" & ready to participate.

- At the start of class, you are to put your phone in your backpack or in the holder.
- Phones are to be kept away for the duration of class time.
- You are expected to use your school issued Chromebook for online activities.
- You are expected to check Google Classroom notifications/emails regularly.



**Classwork/Participation:

The nature of language learning requires active participation.

Participation in class discussions and activities, in Spanish, is a fundamental aspect of the course and this grade must be earned on a daily basis. The use of English will be as minimal as possible as one of our primary goals is to improve each student's communication skills. Remember, our objective is that each student improves his/her Spanish, so do not get discouraged if a fellow student has had more practice than you. Challenge yourself to speak as much Spanish as possible throughout our lessons.

Your participation grade counts toward **20**% of your quarterly average & is based on the following:

- timely arrival to class
- preparation for the day's lesson (supplies, homework, etc)
- contributing to a positive classroom atmosphere
- participation in all activities (including speaking and written*)

*such as: warm ups, group work, review activities, worksheets, listening assessments

So... How can I earn a good grade for participation?

IT'S REALLY EASY!!! First of all, be on time, be prepared and be positive! Secondly, be sure to volunteer often. Try to use the material we are learning in class to give quality New York State Checkpoint B responses. Use complete, upper level sentences that incorporate the grammar and vocabulary we are practicing in class. Ask questions, respond to discussions, complete activities, share your own ideas, etc... IN SPANISH!

Remember: Part of your final exam is based on speaking, so participate often!

Attendance:

Regular attendance is absolutely necessary for growth in language proficiency. It is difficult to catch up when you are absent from a language class because you are missing critical communication components that <u>can't</u> easily be done at home

(ex: listening activities, participation in class discussions, speaking/interacting in Spanish, etc).

Therefore, to be successful in this course, you must attend class consistently.

CHECK GOOGLE CLASSROOM FIRST!

If you are absent: YOU are responsible to obtain any notes, assignments, announcements, etc.

Work that is not made up in a timely fashion (2-3 days) will result in a zero. If you miss a test/quiz/project BUT had prior notice of the due date, you will complete the assignment <u>THE DAY YOU RETURN TO CLASS</u>.

**Of course you can see me to schedule review/extra help after school or in study hall. But, it isn't fair to the rest of the students to use up their class time to catch you up, so please check Google first and then see me during downtime to set up a meeting.

Class Procedures:

- Enter our room quickly & quietly.

- Complete the warm up assignments.
- Follow instructions & complete the tasks.
- Be attentive during the lesson & actively involved.
- Any side conversations must stop when Señorita is addressing the class.
- Do not pack up your belongings until instruction is finished & you are given permission to do so.
- Keep your work area (desk, floor, row, etc) tidy.
- Expect to use your agenda passes for lavatory use. (Please don't interrupt class, but wait for an appropriate time to ask.) Return to class within a reasonable amount of time and be quiet in the hallway.
- Be positive and treat others with kindness.

Academic Honesty:

If a student is involved in academic dishonesty (cheating*, plagiarism, etc.), a zero will be given for that assignment. No make-up assignment will be provided.

*Cheating includes (but is not limited to) copying someone else's work (including HW), using online translator websites, Artificial Intelligence apps, discussing the content of test/quiz questions, etc.

After the pandemic, there has been an increased technology usage. As a result, the temptation to utilize online translation software/websites can be strong.

You are expected to do your own work.

Using online sources and claiming it to be your own is considered CHEATING.

Fire Drills / Emergencies:
