**Course Description**: Pre-AP English I encompasses a broad study of literature and nonfiction by authors from different cultural backgrounds and eras. Genres we will study include short fiction, poetry, drama, literary nonfiction, expository, or informational writing, and the novel. Our emphasis will be on building comprehension of these texts through thoughtful class discussions and assignments designed to place the reader -- *you* -- in a position of authority. This means that everyone in the class will be able to talk purposefully about the material and help other students see these texts through different lenses and from different angles. We will use our understanding of the elements of literature (character, conflict, imagery, etc.) to further strengthen our comprehension and help us gain valuable skills in the art of literary analysis.

### **NOTE** on texts and materials:

- © All necessary materials (texts, novels, workbooks, etc.) will be provided by the school district.
- However, students may find it beneficial to purchase their own copies of certain texts so that they:
  - ...will have access to that text when it is convenient for them.
  - ...may annotate the texts and mark up pages in preparation for class discussions & writing. (school-provided texts cannot be annotated).
  - Students will be provided with a reasonable window of time to purchase their own copies if they choose to do so.
- When possible, texts will be made available in a digital format (often a PDF) online through Google Classroom. This will allow students access from any device connected to the internet.

## **Grading Policies**

All grading policies align with guidelines within the Frontier English Department and Frontier Central School District. In addition, grade guidelines and rubrics established by the College Board will be used throughout the assessment process.

**Major Grades** (50%) of the overall grade may include:

- © AP Style MC Tests and AP Writing Assignments.
- © Research Projects.

**Minor Grades** (50%) of the overall grade may include:

- © Composition Notebook Writing and Notes.
- © Class Participation
- © Groupwork & Presentations

Late Work Policy: As an AP Pathway course students should understand that <u>late work is generally not accepted</u>. Students are expected to utilize class time and manage their time outside of class in order to meet clear deadlines and due dates.

Major work turned in late (*one-day maximum*) will be graded and receive **no higher than an 85%.** Minor work turned in late (*one-day maximum*) will be graded and receive **no higher than a 70%**.

**Note on Late Work:** Students should bring any special or personal circumstances regarding their inability to complete an assignment to the teacher's attention. A teacher may choose to offer a student the opportunity to submit late work as s/he, they deem appropriate, based on the significance of the late assignment, the nature of the student's predicament, etc.

## Attendance (Absences & Tardiness)

Students are expected to attend class and be on time regularly. If an absence does occur, all work will be posted on our Google Classroom site. It is the student's responsibility to check Google Classroom, complete all posted assignments, and contact the teacher if there are any questions. Students who are regularly tardy will be warned after the 1st occurrence, and referrals will be made after the 2nd occurrence.

**Cell Phone & Other Electronic Devices**: Unless permitted by the teacher, all cell phones and electronic devices (iPads, handheld devices, etc.) are to be turned off and put away.
