The Final Copy is not just a neater version of the rough draft; it is new and *improved*!

### For your Introduction:

(Indent) 1.Attention grabber. (2.Explain the quotation or give some background about the statistic.) 3.Context (Why are people worried or hopeful about the future?) 4.Connecting thought to your ... 5.Thesis statement.

The Thesis statement must be the last sentence in your *Introduction*.

#### **Example Introduction:**

atten-grabber

Stephen Dedalus said, "The past is a nightmare from which I am trying to awake." He was referring to the sad history of violence and repression, which has marked life on Earth since mankind's earliest days. If our past has been a nightmare, then our future should be a wonderful dream. Some people believe that our current problems will lead to a future that is even more violent, repressive, and difficult. They believe Dedalus's nightmare will continue; however, there are good reasons to hope, even to dream. The future may be a much better place where humanity will flourish.

#### How to write a conclusion:

- reword your thesis statement
- (mention the topics in your three topic sentences)
- refer back to your attention-grabber (indirectly - don't repeat it word-for-word)

The Conclusion is the reverse of your Introduction!

Humanity can look forward to a much better future where everyone will have an opportunity to flourish. Technology should help us solve our environmental and food problems. Society and the family will continue to strengthen. I hope to contribute to this brighter future in my community and in my work. We can turn our nightmares into dreams.
