

Goal:


- practice the five reading strategies

 (it is her da)
- evaluating ("ANIMAL") (Jeepers, that was good)

Did their ELA teacher tell the kids to be sure to use reading strategies when they went to the "pictures"?

Heck No!

It's what people do naturally when they are THINKING about anything!

The movie theater is dark; therefore, the kids are "reading" in the dark.
