Rules for Subordinating Conjunctions

- 1. subordinate clauses can't stand alone as complete sentences
- 2. the subordinating conjunction fits with only one clause or "sentence"
- 3. the subordinating conjunction goes AT THE **BEGINNING** of the clause (not at the end)
- 4. the subordinate "sentence" can go first,

subordinating conjunction. If you place the subordinate clause first, be sure to use a comma. Before you write out the new sentence, place a star next to the clause that will take the subordinating conjunction.

 - ★There are hungry bears and unguarded campsites. (wherever)
- 2. We maintain our love for freedom.
 - The United States Constitution will last another two hundred years. (if)
- 3. We sat through movie matinees every Saturday.
- We were seven or eight years old. (when)
- 4. ellelinda won the election last year.
 - Melinda is not eligible to run again. (since) [use a pronoun too]
