Fanboys or Subordinate conjunctions? Combine the sentences using the conjunction in parenthesis. You may switch nouns and pronouns. Write out the sentence. Make sure the punctuation is correct.

1. His mother works late. John helps cook the dinner. (when)

When John's mother works late, he helps cook the dinner.

2. Fran really needs to pass this test. She is doing some extra studying. (so)

Fran needs to pass this test, so she is doing some extra studying.

3. Joe did poorly on the test. Joe must stay after school. (because)

*Joe must stay after because he did poorly.
or Because Joe did poorly, he must stay after.*

4. It managed to win the game. The team played poorly. (yet)

The team played poorly, yet it managed to win.

5. Mike cannot throw the ball. He could not kick it to save his life. (nor)

Mike could not throw the ball, nor could he kick it.

6. The economy is improving. Voters are anxious and angry. (even though)

Even though the economy is improving, voters are anxious.

7. You must pass a driving test. You cannot get a license. (unless)

*Unless you pass this driving test, you cannot get a license.
or You cannot get a license unless you pass this.*

8. The Electoral College casts its votes. The president is not officially elected.

(until)

The president is not officially elected until the Electoral College casts its votes.
