Zoom meeting notes April 15, 2020 2:30pm

• The past few weeks were designated skill practice, review and a time for teachers to check in/connect with their students.

• Starting 4/20

- Students in grades PreK- 1 will begin new work using packets and online learning opportunities
 - K-1 teachers will also have Google Classrooms accessible to students in addition to their packets
- Students in grades 2-5 will be learning online using Google Classroom as a "home base".
 - Google classroom will allow students to communicate with their teachers to gain immediate feedback and will give access to learning materials from teachers.
- Special area teachers will also have their own Google Classroom that students can access.
- Teachers will be posting a formalized schedule for their class prior to the start of each week
- Strict privacy laws are being followed by the district and schools regarding online learning. Zoom will not be used as a video conferencing tool for students and teachers
- If your child has not been able to access Google Classroom you need to contact their teacher (via email) IMMEDIATELY.

Instructional Expectations starting 4/20

- Teachers will ease into this new phase of learning with a slightly "less demanding" first few days.
 - The goal is to have students into a routine by Wednesday.
- o Teachers are required to "meet" or touch base with students 2x a week.
- Teachers are using Google Meets that allows discussions and a way for students to ask questions.
 - Google meets also allows students to chat and "see" their classmates which can provide a sense of normalcy to the children.
- Teachers will be providing targeted feedback to students based on their participation and progress on standards.
 - There will be no letter or numeric grading. Teachers will be collecting progress data on students based on their performance and participating through distance learning activities.
- Families are encouraged to give online learning their best try for the first couple weeks, but Ms. Lester understands that each family has different demands and situations right now.

- If your child is struggling or is overwhelmed during the new phase of learning, you must contact the teacher to work out a plan to help support the instructional schedule provided by the teacher.
- Be open and honest with your child's teacher with any concerns.
- The recommended contact method is emailing the teacher to request a phone call for a 1 on 1 discussion.
- Teachers may provide a variety; live lessons, video lessons, online resources/platform learning and Google tasks through Google Classroom.
- On the Blasdell website, there is a link to "Classlink". That is a central log-in for your child. It files their password and gives them automatic access to the learning platforms their teachers are using.

"Events" on Hold

- The PreK lottery is temporarily on hold while the district focusing on rolling out the new phase of learning.
 - Ms. Lester acknowledges that families need PreK information to plan next year and will keep everyone updated.
- Kindergarten registration is in the process of being moved to the website.
 Documents will be scanned in and printable soon.
- Kindergarten Screening and Orientation dates are on hold until further notice.
 Information will be posted as soon as it is available.

Communication

- The district purchased the full version of Bloomz and will push out district level notifications. Please see the invitation on the website.
- o The Blasdell website is becoming more active.
 - The school is having theme weeks where parents send in photos for Mrs.
 Santillo to post.
 - Important documents will be posted on the school website. Families will receive notification through Bloomz of recent posts.
- CSE meetings will be done on Google Meets. Parents should watch for email invitations.
- If your child receives services such as OT/PT, those teachers should be reaching out to parents. If not, you should email them.
- No-one may enter the building. If school does NOT resume, arrangements will be made for personal item pickups when it is safe for people to enter the buildings again.

• Technology/Devices Update

- o On 3/12/20 teachers began to survey families about device access.
- Yes, Spectrum is offering free Wi-Fi but it has been reported that it may be months before they can provide to everyone.
- Families who indicated to teachers that they need devices in initial surveys or emails will be provided with Chromebooks.
 - Number of Chromebooks depend on number of children in the home.
 - 1-2 students = 1 Chromebook

- 3 or more students= 2 Chromebooks
- Parents should watch their mail for an invitation to pick up Chromebooks at school.
 - There will be additional paperwork to fill out before the Chromebook may be loaned out. Must have all paperwork at time of pick-up.
 - It will be a one-day pickup (approximately 4 hours) at the bus doors for Blasdell.
 - Chromebooks are organized by family invited to Chromebook pick-up.
- Tech support will be available to families. Email your child's teacher or the school librarian Beth Selig. Issues they cannot resolve will be handled by tech support.
- If you did not respond to a survey or email your child's teacher but need a device- you need to do so immediately.
 - There will potentially be a Wave 2 of device distribution but there are no details at this time.
 - The district is focusing on the transition to online learning this week of 4/20 and will hopefully have more information in upcoming weeks about "wave 2".
