### Principals Report – Shannon Thurston

Mrs. Thurston said that the open house went well and she will be looking for input for next year. The playground construction will begin in mid-May. The current playground will remain open during construction. Painting will continue and wood flooring will be put into the office during Spring break. They are looking into updating the navy blue tile in the new wing to Frontier Blue, and asking about painting the cafeteria.

Title 1 Presentation: Title 1 is a Federally Funded program that began in 1956 and was updated in 1994. It is a National program that help close the educational gap and provide a high quality education. \$14 billion dollars is distributed to about 50% of public schools that qualify to receive the funding. To meet the requirements 40% minimum, need to qualify for free/reduced lunch in the school. At Blasdell: 52.5% qualify for free, 5.5% qualify for reduced for a total of 58%. Blasdell uses the funding for: (3) Reading teachers, (1) math teacher, the preschool program, instructional materials, supplies, manipulatives, teacher resources and supplemental instruction.

Follow up questions were asked regarding parent involvement, and how the funds are being allocated. Mrs. Thurston said it is determined at the district level and she would follow up, or anyone can email with specific questions.

  - Spring Bookfair was our most successful yet! \$10,552.41 in total sales. Mrs. Fuchs won the door decorating contest and received \$25 ins scholastic dollars. The school raised \$2,661.61 in the Books for Change Drive; the library was able to purchase new books at the bookfair. Thank you to everyone that made it so successful! Our current Scholastic Dollar balance is: \$7,263.34. Some of this money does expire. \$1,000.00 of it will need to be used by September 2023. Discussions were had on purchasing the incoming kindergarten books with that money and the PTA asked Mrs. Thurston if she had any suggestions/wish list to be looked at using some scholastic dollars to fund.
  - Me and My Gal will be held at the Palace Theater on May 13<sup>th</sup> at 11am-1pm. We will work on getting a backdrop/red carpet for photo opportunity and supply some snacks. The movie still will be voted on.

  - Future fundraising was discussed: car washes, doing two fundraisers at one time, Raygay sales for a color/fun run.
  - Lizzie is looking into and applying for grants for a Book Vending Machine. We will probably need to start a committee. The Vending Machine costs around \$6,000.00. Once we have the machine, we can stock it with books using scholastic dollars.
  - First Day School Supplies will begin and run through July 1<sup>st</sup>. The prices will be up from last year.
  - Cider and Donuts is being rescheduled to a popsicle day – need a day.
