






A Parent's Guide to Growth Mindset

What is Growth Mindset anyway?

A person has a growth mindset when they believe that their intelligence and basic abilities can be improved through hard work, dedication, and positivity.



Someone with a Growth Mindset might say:

"How can I improve?"

"I need to take responsibility in order to learn."

"Failures will help me learn."
"I don't know how, but I will learn."

"Challenges will help me grow!"

FIXED MINDSET

What is Fixed Mindset anyway?

A person has a fixed mindset when they believe that their intelligence and basic abilities is the way it is and cannot grow.



Someone with a Fixed Mindset might say:

"I could never learn how to do that."

"My parent is not good at math, so I won't be good either." "She's naturally smart, I will never be as smart as her." "I dislike making mistakes."

> "I won't try because I don't want to look bad." "I'll do the easiest option, so I don't fail."
