• **TRANSPORTATION UPDATE** - The District continues to try to improve the bus run situation. Below are the recommended changes that we have already made or are waiting to make within the next couple of days.

BUS ADJUSTMENTS:

- **Bus 3** Added a Big Tree am run which reduced the drive time for the traditional run.
- **Bus 5** Placed a consistent driver on this run. This run had been handled by bus substitute drivers for much of the first 3-4 first weeks.
- Bus 27 Split off some students and sent them to Bus 2.
- Bus 28, 186 & 300 These are special needs runs and we changed some routing and made some adjustments to pick up and drop off times.
- CHARTER RUNS In addition to these shifts we will be bidding out seven non-pub/charter runs. These runs will service Nardin, Maritime Charter, West Seneca, Southtowns Catholic (2) and St. Peter and Paul (2).
- VERSATRANS APP Finally, we will be demoing the better version of the Versatrans app. We hope this will improve parents' ability to track their children's bus runs.

- INCREASED SAFETY PROTOCOLS The District met with a parent group from the Middle School in order to get feedback on additional safety protocols for all of our schools. Ideas included:
 - 1. Metal detectors
 - 2. Clear backpacks
 - 3. Additional SRO
 - 4. Adding of additional hallway monitors
 - 5. FOB tracking systems for student attendance
 - All of these ideas will be taken to our District Safety Committee for review and possible implementation. Please note there were many other ideas shared and the above list only represents a small sample.
- COVID-19 PROXIMAL VS. SURVEILLANCE TESTING A reminder to all families that the District has partnered with Erie County Department of Health in order to provide voluntary testing for our students, if requested. This testing is for STUDENTS ONLY.
 - PROXIMAL TESTING Proximal testing is available for students if there is a
 confirmed positive case in the school setting. This testing is not done if a child
 comes into contact with an individual outside of school. It is intended to get
 students tested and return to in-person learning as quickly as possible. There is a
 minimum 3-5 day incubation period prior to this test being given.
 - SURVEILLANCE TESTING Surveillance Testing happens on a weekly basis.
 Each week, we will be randomly selecting and testing a group of those who have consented to participate in this program. This means that your child will not be tested every week.
