• **AP SCIENCE** - AP Biology held an "organelle speed dating" activity. They had to find "the perfect match" based on food webs, environmental conditions and ecological relationships.

- ECDOH NEWEST COVID-19 GUIDANCE If your child has tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 90 days and becomes symptomatic, they do not need a negative NAAT test, a doctor's note with alternative diagnosis, or staying out for 10 days since onset of symptoms to return to school. They should remain out of school until they are fever-free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications and show symptom improvement.
