
COMPUTER SCIENCE EDUCATION








- DECADES DAY Phoebe Gollnau and

- GOT WATER? In Mr. Penberthy's class, as part of the 5th grade "Got Water?" science unit, one of the lessons is a simulation of the negative

effects of plastic waste, oil spills, acid rain, and pesticides on lake animals. Each student simulated an animal and had to collect food (beads) from the gym floor. In the second round all students except for four were hindered by one of the pollutants and had to modify their eating (illustrated by walking while holding their ankles) which then affected their ability to survive by collecting enough food. - PARENT PORTAL UPDATE Over the past three months the District has been
 demoing student information systems (SIS). The decision on the direction of the SIS has
 been determined by the ability of the new system, eSchool, to communicate with our
 existing systems and usability for our staff. The three primary areas it needed to be
 compatible with are:
 - Google Classroom Our primary digital medium for classroom instruction and distance learning when needed.

- eDoctrina- This system is used to build students assessments in the classroom and as an evaluation tool for our instructional staff.
- Versatrans (Tyler Technologies) Versatrans is the system we use for our bus routing software.
- AMSDELL ROAD Erie County Department of Public Works provided us with an
 updated road closure plan that will imminently impact our transportation runs to not only
 the Middle School but many of our other routine school runs. Below I have attached the
 schedule of repairs provided to us as a resource for your family:
 - 12/16- Single lane closure all day
 - 12/17- Amsdell Rd. Closed for all traffic 9am- 2pm
 - 12/20- Amsdell Rd. Closed for all traffic 9am- 2pm
 - 12/21-12/31- Single lane closure all day
