To address Bullying in our school district, we target the whole school population - not just the bullies. Parents and most of all, our youth, need to be aware of appropriate behaviors and how inappropriate behaviors should and will be addressed.

Frontier Central School District has adopted a variety of strategies and enforcement plans in a comprehensive school safety program so that all our students feel safe.

The programs and interventions utilized by our School Social Workers have been derived from research for their effectiveness in reducing existing bullying problems and preventing the development of future problems. Lessons about Bullying comply with the New York State Laws which require districts to educate students regarding bullying and the harmful effects.

Bullying behavior is evident in pre-school and generally peaks in the Middle School. It's important, therefore, that bullying intervention strategies are implemented as early as possible. Even if only a small number of students are directly involved, every student who witnesses bullying is affected in some way.
